

A zine is a small collection of artistic content that fits a theme. Often done by one artist, or a small group of artists, they are made by hand and then photocopied for distribution. Created specifically for you by five Wisconsin based artists, this zine was intended for you to use as a creative workbook.



“America the Beautiful”

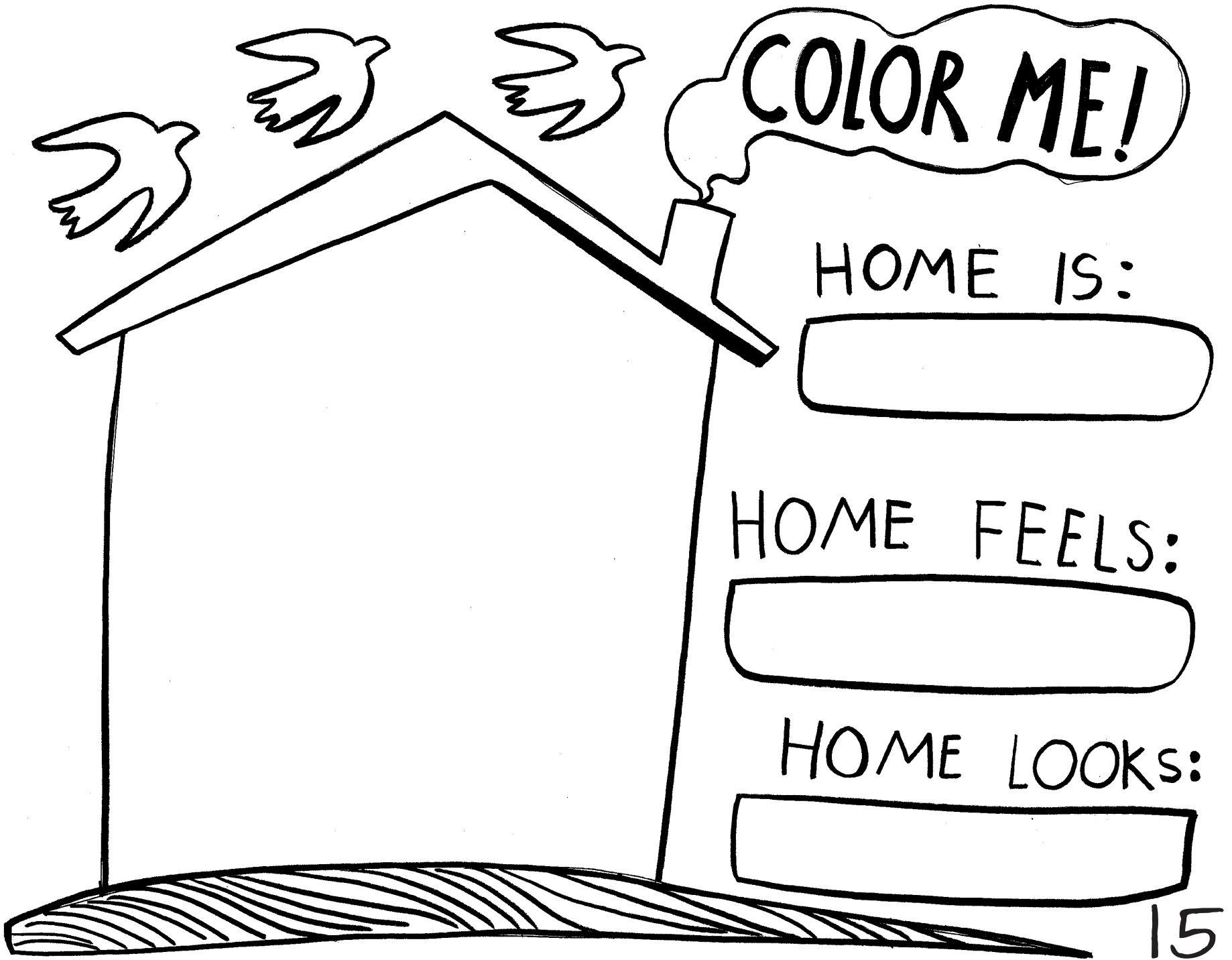
